The Infants coloured and cut out doves, a symbol of peace. The Juniors were given situations in which there was a conflict and they had to find a peaceful solution. Some examples of the problems are:

Your sister/brother is always going into your room and borrowing stuff without asking? What could you do? (Call Dad!)

We have been trying to take this into our every day lives and students were using words to work out any problems they had, particularly during break times. Each child wrote or drew what peace meant to them. This has been displayed on one of our boards.



Our assembly was well attended and all of the school took part. Year 6 told us about a young boy, a refugee, who has opened a school for other refugees. He started teaching there

himself, even though he was only 12 years old when he started!

Year 3 told us about another person who believes that education is vital to all: Malala.

The Infants sang a song about 'Joy, Peace and Love'.

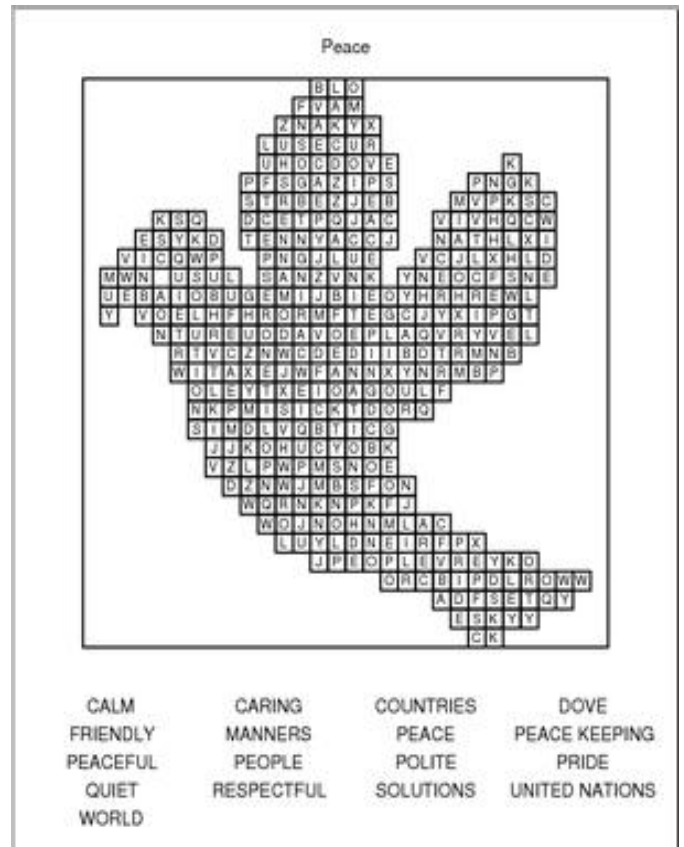
Year 4 told us about Nelson Mandela, an important figure in the history of world peace.
